THEMES 2024-2025

Welcome to the 2024-2025 academic year! We look forward to learning and exploring together. All year round the children will be learning about safety, hygiene, appropriate classroom behavior & good manners, numbers, letters, colours, shapes, discussion of the days of the week and the weather. Math concepts (ex. whole, half, quarter, more than, less than) are incorporated into meal and snack times. Special days, like Valentine's Day, are celebrated on the actual day or the day closest to it.

French is incorporated into the daily curriculum in the older two- and three-year-old classes through circle time activities such as stories, songs, calendar and discussions. The 4-K class features a **French immersion** curriculum. The **French** speaking educator addresses the children in **French** and a significant portion of the day is dedicated to only speaking in **French**. The children's **French** vocabulary will also increase through the use of concrete, everyday words at mealtime and during activities. Parents will be provided with vocabulary handouts so that they can reinforce at home what is being learned in class.

Our Science program includes learning about Canada's biomes. Canada has four main biomes: **tundra, desert, grassland, and forest**. As part of the monthly themes, such as "Hibernation and Migration", "Water Water Everywhere" and "Animals In The Wild" the children will be discussing the community of plants and animals in each biome.

Every month, from January through August, the children will also be learning about a different **inventor or scientist** and their inventions and discoveries.

Living Values is a key part of the K.I.D.S. educational program. The goal of **Living Values is to model and promote civility for the children**. As part of this program, the children will be discussing such topics as *respect, love and responsibility*. Community caring and sharing activities and programs can include: **a seasonal food drive, Valentine's Day cards for seniors, and ongoing can tab collection**.

Our **Music Appreciation/Sleep time Symphonies** program focuses on different composers and genres of music. Children spend two months listening to the composer's music, reading stories about their lives and celebrating the composer's birthdays.

Our **Art Appreciation** program focuses on a different artist every two months. The children will be read stories inspired by the artist's life and discuss his or her paintings. They will also be introduced to a selection of art movements and styles (Cubism, Abstract)

A daily exercise activity is being incorporated into our morning Circle Time. In addition to story time and theme related discussions the children will be encouraged to stretch, jump, wiggle and shake.

Weekly Parent Reflection Questions will be posted in the daycare weekly and sent to the parents through Planitou. The purpose of these questions is to help the parents better know and understand their child and her/his development/behavior/childhood.

Donations of magazines with pictures, paper towel rolls, samples pieces (material, quartz counter pieces, carpet, wallpaper etc.) are always appreciated.

Famous Inventors & Scientists: Galileo (telescope) & Canadian Astronaut Chris Hadfield



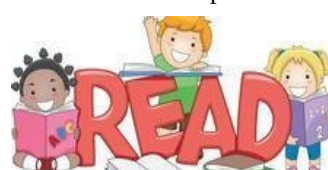
